THE FIRST LESSON ~ Leviticus 19:1-2, 9-18

The Lord spoke to Moses, saying: Speak to all the congregation of the people of Israel and say to them: You shall be holy, for I the Lord your God am holy. When you reap the harvest of your land, you shall not reap to the very edges of your field, or gather the gleanings of your harvest. You shall not strip your vineyard bare, or gather the fallen grapes of your vineyard; you shall leave them for the poor and the alien: I am the Lord your God. THE INVITATION TO AND DISTRIBUTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

All persons are welcome at the Lord's table; to receive Holy Communion or a Blessing. Baptized Christians of all ages and denomination may receive the elements. To receive a blessing rather than the elements, cross your arms over your chest as you kneel at the altar rail. To receive communion please hold out your crossed hands, open palms up, for the bread, and then help guide the chalice to your lips to receive the wine; cross your arms over your chest if you do not wish to receive the wine. Please blot lipstick before drinking from the chalice. You may also allow the chalice minister to dip the bread into the wine and place it on your tongue and it is permissible to receive only the bread if you like.

To receive an individual prayer of healing with anointing (Unction), go to the chapel after you receive Communion. Kneel as you are able at the altar rail in the chapel leaving some space between you and the next person for privacy. Return to the cathedral after the priest has prayed with you.

Canon David Lowry presents Jewish and Christian Apocalyptic: Daniel and the Revelation to John, Wednesdays in Lent (March 8, 15, 22, 29, and April 5), 1:30-2:30 PM. Judaism and Christianity had an idea of the meaning of history that differed from that of other ancient cultures and religions—they believed that God was in charge of history and that history was linear: that is moving from one place forward to another in accordance with God's purposes (rather than moving in circles)—purposes that remained veiled at most times and to most people. Hence, apocalyptic literature (apocryphal=hidden) was unique to the Jewish and Christian theological traditions. We will read carefully from the Old Testament book of Daniel and from the Revelation to John; seeking out not only the special place that each occupies in their respective canons, but also their relevance today.
