

From The Dean ...

What are the three most important lessons that you have ever learned, and how did you learn them?

As a new year, a new decade begins; let's look to the past for a moment. It is received wisdom that the angels and demons from our history will often inform our present, and shape our future, even if they take somewhat different shapes and forms over the course of our life. Each of us is an individual creation of the Almighty, and, although we have much in common with our fellow humans, we are unique in our particular life experience and journey.



When one is baptized, we remember aloud that it is a baptism first into Christ's death, that through his death we may share in the promise of His resurrection. You have made it to this point in your life by engaging myriad challenges and obstacles; not death per se, but certainly times of feeling overwhelmed and hopeless. No one enjoys these low points, but they can prove pivotal, inviting us to see that it is only by God's grace that we exist at all and that whatever becomes of us, in life or death, we are covered under the "shadow of His wings" as the psalmist so profoundly says.

You are far more than the sum of your experiences, yet it is in the fullness of our past that we find tools to guide us through the present. What do you treasure most about your life thus far? Use this as a point of departure for orienting your future toward similar energy. When we ask God to be our ruler and guide, He opens a path before us leading ever deeper into His sheltering and redeeming love.
