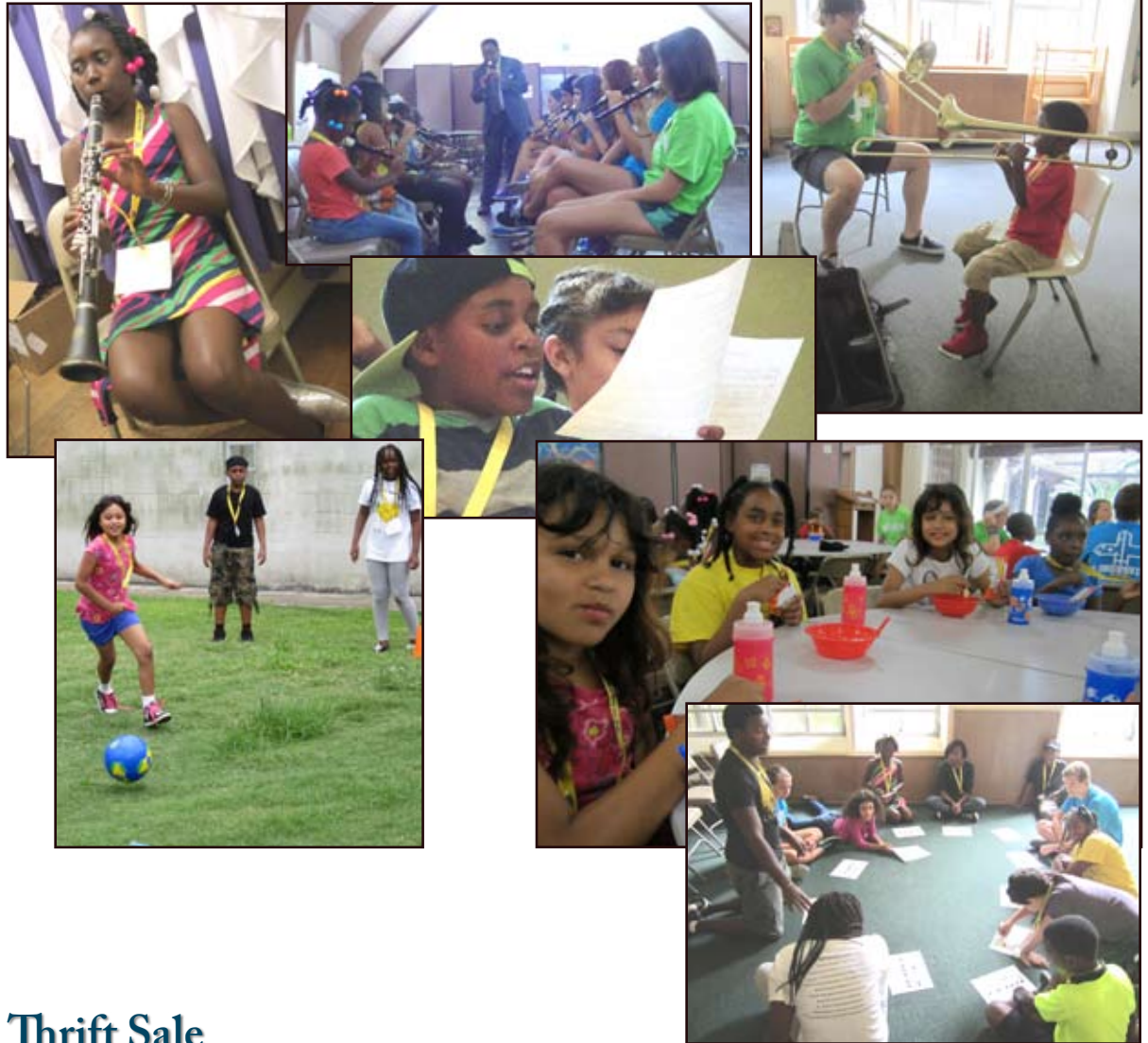

Anna's Arts Summer Camp

The Cathedral once again hosted Anna's Arts for Kids summer camp. The four week camp, a mission of St.

Anna's Episcopal Church, concluded in July. Thirty children enjoyed: daily music history lessons taught by a member of the Louisiana Philharmonic Orchestra; individual instrument lessons in violin, percussion, trumpet, trombone, clarinet, piano, and rhythm and note reading also taught by members of the LPO; voice and choir; soccer; tutoring in reading; visual arts and sewing; swimming lessons; field trips to the New Orleans Museum of Art and the French Quarter; daily lunch and snacks provided by Second Harvest; and special concerts by members of the LPO and our own organist, Jarrett Follette.

The camp ended with a final performance by the children. *Anna's Arts for Kids* will continue their mission of teaching and nurturing children this fall with an afternoon tutoring program and Saturday Arts Academy. Jennifer Buckley and Vicki Moreland represent the Cathedral on the Advisory Council. Talk to Jennifer or Vicki to learn how you can help or to sponsor a child.

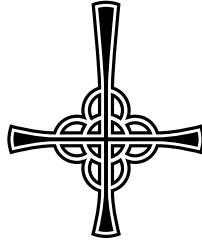
